A note from Rev. Cathy:

In February in Chapel we heard stories of God calling God's people to do hard things, promising to be with us wherever we go. We heard the story of Moses meeting God in the burning bush and calling Moses to lead the Israelites out of slavery into Egypt, and about how God called the shepherd boy David, the youngest of Jesse's 8 sons, to be king, and how God saw that David had a good heart.

In March we returned to the theme of God's steadfast love for God's people and how we reflect God's love in our relationships with one another. We heard the story of God giving Moses and the Israelites the 10 Commandments - 10 ways to show love for God and for each other. We heard the story of the widow Naomi and her daughter-in-law Ruth returning together to Naomi's home in Bethlehem. There they met Boaz, and Boaz fell in love with Ruth, whom he noticed because of her good heart and steadfast love for Naomi. And we learned about how Ruth and Boaz were the great grandparents of the shepherd boy David who became king.
